

Matt Cox, ASUO student affairs coordinator, is coordinating the registration drive at the University.

"The best way to have an effect on (the legislature) is to vote," Cox said. "(People in the legislature) will tell you that straight up. You'll sit in that legislator's office in Salem and they'll say, 'I've listened to your argument and I understand your points and I support it, but if no one in your constituency is voting, then I can't play ball with you.'"

The SCHE, ASUO, and SOURCE hope to get enough student voters registered statewide to be a potent force in the legislature primaries in May and force a special session of

the Legislature in May, June or August.

The University suffered major cuts last year in the wake of phase one of Measure 5. In all: The College of Human Development and Performance closed, graduate teacher education programs were eliminated, there were 200 layoffs, 1,500 fewer students and 22 programs that were either altered or closed.

The University Budget Office has proposed a \$450 increase in the non-resident tuition surcharge for 1992-93. The proposal has to be ratified by the State Board of Higher Education.

Last year the state system of higher education lost 3,000 students and 68 degree programs, said Kate Menard, executive assistant with the Oregon Student Lobby.

working," Pope said.

The program places a heavy emphasis on raising awareness about environmental issues like the spotted owl controversy.

"We help them understand society's impact on the environment," Pope said. "They develop a sense of responsibility and community that will help them be educated voters."

Crews meet regularly to talk about environmental issues. Wells said the often tense debates can cause friction within the group, but the coopera-

tion needed to complete the projects creates unity.

"By the end of six weeks, it's your crew," Wells said. "You work together, cook together and live together."

Wells said the program tends to attract a certain type of person.

"The kind of kid who agrees to sign up and go away for a summer is going to be into getting away and challenging themselves," Wells said.


NYC crewmembers are paid \$4.75 an hour, while crew leaders earn \$50 a day. The program is currently accepting applications for the 1992 summer sessions.
