

Devils, Wildcats pitch heartbreakers to Ducks

The Oregon softball team came close to winning three of four Pacific-10 Conference games this weekend against the nationally ranked Arizona schools.

Very close. In the end, however, the Ducks lost all four, including three by one run. The most difficult loss was a 3-2 heartbreaker to second-ranked Arizona in the nightcap of Sunday's doubleheader at Tucson.

Oregon, now 15-21 overall and 3-7 in the Pac-10, also dropped both games Saturday evening to No. 20 Arizona State, each by a single run.

Things started poorly for the Ducks in the first game Sunday against the Wildcats, as they were shut out on just five hits by Ari-

zona's ace, Debby Day. Day raised her record to 23-2 as the Wildcats won easily, 6-0.

But the Ducks came back strong in the second game, and Laura Schmidt's first home run of the season led Oregon to a 1-0 lead after three innings.

Arizona came back with two runs in the fourth and another in the fifth, but Schmidt again rallied Oregon with an RBI single in the seventh.

Then Day, who relieved Arizona starter Susie Parra in the second inning, was able to shut the Ducks out to preserve her 24th win of the season. Day struck out eight and gave up just three hits for the game, two by Schmidt.

The Wildcats improved to 44-4 overall and 9-1 in the Pac-10.

Oregon must have been used to coming from behind after Saturday's doubleheader at Arizona State.

Through six innings of the first game the Sun Devils led 9-0. But Oregon mounted a spectacular rally in the top of the seventh, getting to within a single run before falling 9-8.

Shelly Schumacher and Leanne Brooks each had two-run singles during the Ducks' last-inning spurt, and Kim Manning, Jennifer Piper and Tracey Simmons each had RBI hits.

Oregon again spotted Arizona State a lead in the second game, trailing the Sun Devils 2-0 entering the seventh inning.

The Ducks refused to go away but couldn't build on Piper's RBI single and lost 2-1. Arizona State improved to 23-17 overall, 3-5 in the Pac-10.

Oregon next faces top-ranked and undefeated UCLA in a Friday afternoon doubleheader at Howe Field. The first game gets under way at 2:30.
