Jerod Hume

Jerod Hume, candidate for a one-year IFC seat, is a sophomore majoring in business. He is also assistant treasurer in his fraternity and treasurer/financial adviser of the cable access television show *Our Version of Hell*.

ODE: Do you favor across-the-board cuts as a means of keeping fees low, and if so how much?

Hume: Yes, in that too many groups deficit spend without any kind of responsibility or financial accountability to anyone. If cuts were to be made, I would suggest approximately 20 percent for those groups that did not take responsibility with their spending last year.

ODE: How would you ensure that every group gets a fair hearing and a fair budget?

Hume: Come to the hearings. If they just show up the committee takes care of whether they get a fair hearing or not. As long as they get to tell their side of the story, they should get a fair hearing. They should show where they spend their money, how they spend their money, and who gets their

money.

ODE: Do you believe it's appropriate to hold current group directors accountable for mismanagement by former directors?

Hume: Yes, because the whole group is responsible, the administration of each group should be responsible for their financial standing no matter what's happened in the past.

In any business, if the business in the past made poor financial choices, the business now is responsible for those. They can't just say 'the past person screwed up, let's forget about it.' No, they are responsible for their debts that they incur in the past and present and they should pay those off before they expect any more student money.

ODE: Would you be in favor of cutting large budgets to compensate for increasing or maintaining the budgets of smaller groups?

Hume: You have to look at each group individually. Those groups that waste money should have it taken away, the small groups that only need a



little bit, (should) make it themselves.

ODE: Why should students vote for you?

Hume: Because I'm not out to further my own personal agenda. I'm not out to help any minority groups or any specific group. I'm out to save money for the University. I'm out to save money for all students because I'm sick of seeing my own money wasted on organizations that I have no benefit from.

I get no benefit from 75 percent of the groups that get my money and I'm tired of it, and I think a lot of other people are too. I'm out there to promote financial responsibility and financial accountability.

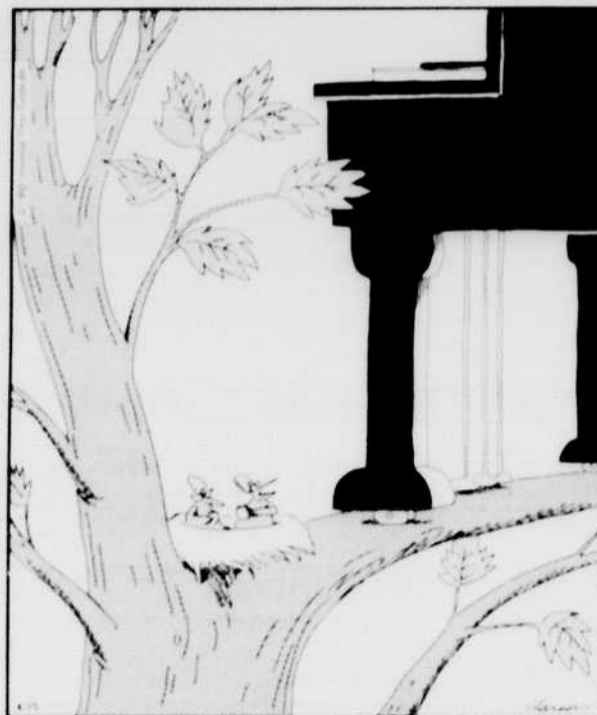
