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**IFC CANDIDATE PROFILES**

**Barbara Rodgers**

Barbara Rodgers is a junior majoring in sociology and minoring in women's studies. She is also co-director for Saferide.

**ODE:** Do you favor across-the-board cuts as a means of keeping fees low?

**Rodgers:** I do not favor across-the-board cuts. I don't think that fees should be raised, but I think it's important to make sure that we still have the student groups there and still are able to give the students services.

**ODE:** How would you ensure that every group gets a fair hearing and a fair budget?

**Rodgers:** I would make sure that I would work along with the student groups. As being part of a student group right now, it's really important that they understand the budget problems and that they understand the goals of the IFC —

and that's not to raise the fees.

In the hearings that do come up, I would need to make sure that I understand what the group actually does. I've been around the University a long time, so I know a lot of the groups.

I also know a lot about budgeting and that you can cut what you can cut in certain places and (know) what needs to stay there.

**ODE:** Do you believe it's appropriate to hold current group directors accountable for mismanagement by former directors?

**Rodgers:** No, but I think we need to make sure that it doesn't happen again. If they didn't even know the people that were in there before, then that's ridiculous.

It's like across-the-board cuts, you can't do that, I mean, then

what would I be doing in the IFC position if I said, "Let's just cut this across the board." It's more work than that. It depends on each individual case.

You need to problem-solve each individual case that comes up, but if last year you had a problem, you need to make sure that you look back on that so that it doesn't happen again.

**ODE:** Would you be in favor of cutting large budgets to compensate for increasing or maintaining the budgets of smaller groups?

**Rodgers:** It's a lot more work than just making rules like 10 percent, across-the-board or just saying you can (cut) a big budget for a small budget.

**ODE:** Why should students vote for you?

**Rodgers:** I think I would do a really good job, and I think I really understand the student groups and how important they are.

I would like to see the athletic



ic department cut, and the EMU could use some restructuring.

The student groups are definitely fund-raising, but (the athletic department) needs to fund raise (because) they have a lot more resources. Groups like Saferide could not survive without the IFC allocations.

**Anne Wagoner**

Anne Wagoner is a junior political science major with no prior student government or budgeting experience, but she feels that there is room for improvement on the IFC committee and wants to make a positive change.

**ODE:** Do you favor across-the-board cuts as a means of keeping fees low?

**Wagoner:** No, I do not favor across-the-board cuts. Budgets should be reviewed and changes made on a line item basis because I believe across-the-board cuts are detrimental to the programs at the University of Oregon.

**ODE:** How would you ensure that every group gets a fair

hearing and a fair budget?

**Wagoner:** I would ensure that each group gets a fair hearing from my own perspective because I feel that I have the ability to look at both sides of the issues at hand.

I don't favor any one organization more than another.

**ODE:** Do you believe it's appropriate to hold current group directors accountable for mismanagement by former directors?

**Wagoner:** There has to be accountability from program to program. Directors should keep an accurate record of how they are spending the funds. In keeping track of where the money's going the future directors will have an idea of where



things are in the past and if it's not documented, then it can't be addressed.

I feel that the way the IFC funds are dispersed, as far as the time of year or the fact that the early director sets the bud-

et for next year, (is) not very efficient because the old director is setting the budget for activities that the (new) programs are sponsoring.

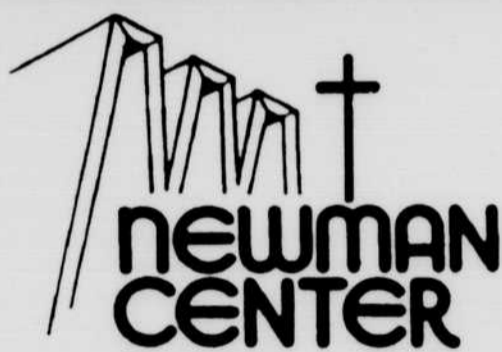
**ODE:** Would you be in favor of cutting large budgets to compensate for increasing or maintaining the budgets of smaller groups?
