that language and English are the official languages of Cameroon.)

His involvement at the University has made him aware of campus issues involving African students.

Vetinde said he feels the University really is trying to diversify itself, but that somehow Africa seems to be left out of the picture.

"If we are to look at the number of courses centered in Africa that are being offered in the University, there are not that many," he said. "I would say that there is quite some diversity, but we could have more diversity. There are very few (courses) on Africa."

The ASA has reached out into the community to provide people with information on Africa by going out and talking about Africa.

"We have a mission of educating the people to facilitate communication between us and the American people and other international students," Vetinde said.

Vetinde also said immigration rules enforced by the Uni-

versity are a hindrance to true diversity on campus. In particular, a rule stating international students need to wait 60 days before they can work on a job site has affected foreign students greatly.

"Immigration and the University are not working hand-in-hand in this case," he said. "The University wants diversity and the immigration rules discourage students from coming here. They don't seem to be having the same vision."

Vetinde also expressed his feelings on the diversity problems in South Africa. The referendum on ending apartheid, pressured by right-wing whites, ended with the majority of whites opposed to the idea of apartheid.

Although this major breakthrough has been made toward the abolishment of apartheid, the old structures of minority rule are still in effect and things haven't changed all that much, he said.

The referendum has, however, opened up diplomatic relations with countries that before had wanted nothing to do with South Africa and its apartheid policy.

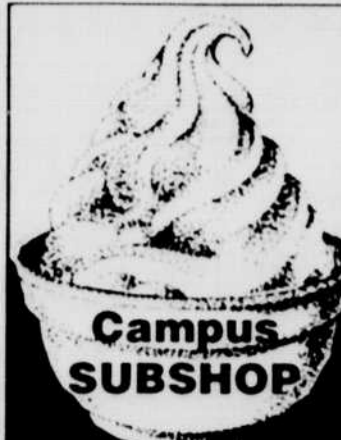
