### Mainstream?

The OCA and its apologists can't get away with the asser-

tion that only extreme liberals oppose anti-gay hatred.

OCA's Measure B victory four years ago was followed by a wave of anti-gay violence around the state, including here in Eugene. The 1989 legislature responded to this wave of violence by adding "sexual orientation" to the classes of people entitled to protection from hate crimes. The OCA anti-gay amendment is designed and intended to overturn this protection.

OCA's endorsement of acts of intimidation and harassment that would be hate crimes if directed at Jews or Catholics is a matter of public record. An official publication of "The No Special Rights Committee," authorized by B. Mabon, treasurer, describes hate crimes euphemistically as "public disapproval of homosexual behavior." This is no different than the Klan claiming that burning a cross on a black man's lawn is simply "freedom of speech."

Mainstream religious leaders, including Oregon's Catholic Bishops and the Board of Directors of Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon, have expressed strong opposition to OCA's anti-gay amendment. In all the years I attended Sunday School, I don't remember a single lesson teaching that people should be persecuted just because they are different.
