Men to host home Invitational

The Oregon men's track team is looking ahead to next weekend's meet with Washington State as it hosts the Oregon Invitational at Hayward Field on Saturday.

The highly regarded Cougars will visit Hayward Field next weekend in what could be Oregon's biggest meet of the season.

The Ducks will be competing with less than a full team this weekend, with head coach Bill Dellinger giving some of his athletes rest and sending others to the Penn Relays on Friday and Saturday in Philadelphia.

"Everything we're doing is with Washington State in mind," Dellinger said.

Bob Gray, Alan Foster and Shannon Lemora — each coming off a victory at last weekend's Pepsi Team Invitational — will miss Saturday's meet and team up in the Penn Relays along with Coley Candaele in the distance medley event.

Lemora, Foster, Candaele and Tracy Hollister will also compete in the 4x1, 1600-meter relay.

Likely to compete at Hayward Field is Art Skipper, whose throw of 251-8 in the javelin last weekend earned him an automatic berth in the NCAA Championships.

Ronnie Harris, who has been competing in the 100, 200 and 400 this season, is also likely to run on Saturday. Harris has been filling in for the injured Devon Hoesy in the 100 and 200, something that Dellinger is not all that happy about.

"We want to get Ronnie more experience in the 400," Dellinger said, "but he'll run the 100 and 200 until Devon Hoesy comes back, which we hope is the Washington State meet."

The rest of the field for the meet will consist of collegiate and post-collegiate athletes.

The meet will begin at 9:30 Saturday morning and the twilight schedule will begin at 4:10 that afternoon. Most of Oregon's athletes will be competing in the evening session.

Oregon women's track at home for invitational

It may not have the glamour of this weekend's Penn Relays, but the Oregon Invitational will have its share of quality athletes Saturday.

About 1,000 total athletes will compete at Hayward Field in what Oregon women's track and field coach Tom Heinonen said is the program's gift to the track community.

"Every year I say that this is our major service to Northwest track and field," Heinonen said.

And with some of the names expected to compete in the women's field Saturday, the Oregon Invitational will be doing quite a service to Eugene track fans, too.

Former Oregon star Paula Berry, who won the 1991 NCAA javelin championship, will return to Hayward Field for maybe the best competition of the event.

Berry will square off against two other former NCAA javelin champions, Jill Smith and Ashley Selman. Smith won the national title in 1988 while a Duck senior, and Selman, a re-

cent Oregon transfer from USC, was the best in the country at the 1990 NCAAAs.

Oregon senior Kim Hyatt, currently the collegiate leader, may be in the competition, too. Hyatt competed at the Penn Relays Thursday.

Another highlight of the meet could be in the long jump, where Oregon school record-holder Julie Bright will go against Finland's Ringa Ropo, who is rated 18th in the world with a best of 22-3 1/2. Ropo may also be entered in the 100-meter dash, where she has run a personal best 11.65.

In the distance events, former Oregon stars Rosa Gutierrez and Ranza Clark should compete. Gutierrez will run the 3,000, and Clark will go for a win in the 1,500, which she is second on Oregon's all-time list with a time of 4:07.5.

The meet will run all of Saturday, beginning with the women's 10,000 at 9:30 a.m., but the featured events will take place during the night session, which starts with the men's javelin at 4:10 p.m. The final event is the men's 10,000 at 7:40 p.m.

Team faces tripleheader

The Oregon softball team will have a good excuse if its players are tired Monday morning.

Starting with this afternoon's tripleheader against non-conference foe Stanford, the Ducks (18-24 overall, 3-9 Pacific-10 Conference) are scheduled to play eight games in three days at Howe Field, including doubleheaders against second-ranked Arizona Saturday and No. 20 Arizona State Sunday.

The whole thing gets under way today at Howe Field, with the first game of the tripleheader scheduled for 12:30 p.m. The start time is two hours earlier than what's listed on the schedule to accommodate the extra game.

On Saturday the Ducks start with an 11 a.m. doubleheader against the Wildcats (48-4 and 11-1), followed by a third game against Stanford.

Sunday features a more conventional doubleheader against Arizona State (25-19 and 5-7) also starting at 11:00 a.m.
