# International career fair set for Saturday

The International Opportunities Fair, set for Saturday, is entering its fourth year as a guide for students interested in international careers.

Because the fair has been on a kind of rotation for the last four years, approximately 75 University students attended the event last year at Oregon State University, but this year will be able to attend right here on campus.

Registration will be from 9 to 9:30 a.m. in the Willamette Hall Atrium.

The fair begins with keynote speaker Glenn Ford, Director of the International Trade Division, giving an address "Inter-

national Trade: Oregon and the World" in 150 Colombia. Then, four breakout groups will branch off to Pacific, Fenton, Willamette, and Lawrence Halls.

The four groups will each emphasize a more specific aspect of international careers to better serve student interests. One group will deal with international job opportunities in government and business. Another will address careers in academic research, such as science and engineering.

The other two groups will address international opportunities in importing/exporting and tourism/transportation.

The fair will host employees from several companies and organizations. Representatives from Nike, Synthetech, Spectrophysics, Alumni Holidays International and U.S.

Customs among others will speak on how they obtained jobs in their fields, and provide hints on starting international careers.

Twenty-four panels spread throughout the four breakout groups will provide students with more career information.

Larry Smith, director of Career Planning and Placement Service, said about 25 percent of University students are interested in a career either directly or indirectly involved with international opportunities.

"The intent is to paint as broad of stroke as we can about ways of being involved in an international context," Smith said.

An example of this "broad stroke" is Paul Layton, owner of the Coffee Corner, who personally accompanies his beans from Nicaragua to the U.S. Ac-

counts from people such as Layton will be available to show students the variety of opportunities they have for travel even if they don't want to live in a foreign country.

Spokespersons from Search North America, a business that deals with environmental problems on an international level, and the Peace Corps will also be there. Smith said the turnout for the fair is expected to be at about 300 with some possible participants from neighboring colleges.

A reception and exhibit by area organizations will conclude the day's events.

Tickets are \$3 for students, \$5 for all others and can be purchased at the EMU Main Desk Store or at registration Saturday morning. The fair runs from 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
