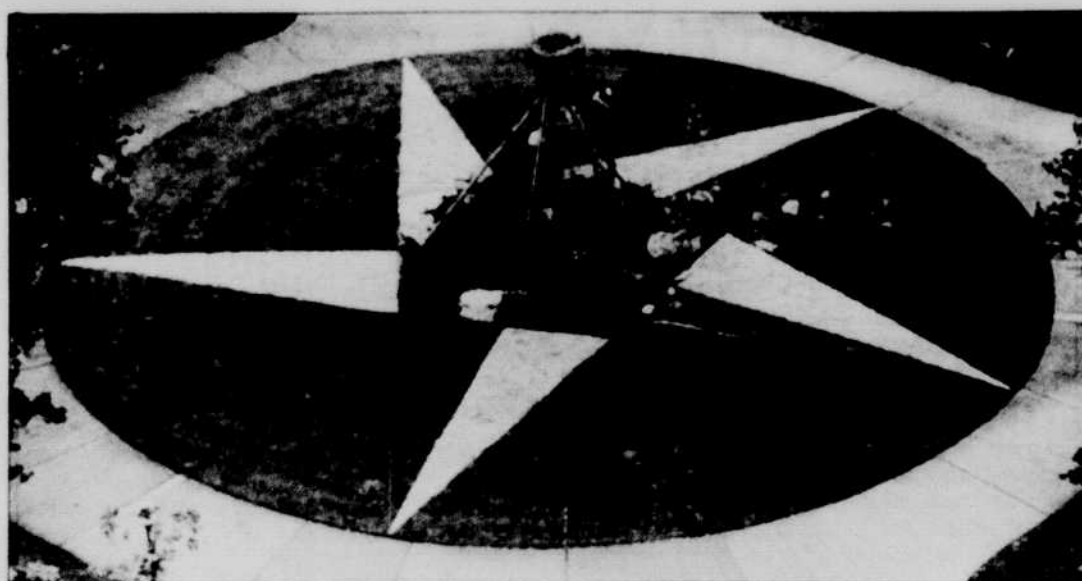

## Elementary schoolers hit campus

Christopher Cornett, a freshman political science major and Stockwell's big buddy, said the project is great for him because he likes to work with young kids.
