I would like to thank Brian Hoop for his commentary "Fee-cutting debate misses target." (*ODE*, April 24). It's one of the clearest and most comprehensive articles I have ever read on the subject. However, at one point it could be inferred the EMU is run solely on the \$2

million student fees.

The EMU has a budget of almost \$5 million, of which \$2 million comes from student fees. Hoop's commentary made it sound as if the Recreation Center receives incidental fees, which it does not. We are a revenue-producing area in the EMU, which means all expenses such as wages, custodial, utilities, equipment and supplies that go into running the services of the Rec. Center are paid by the income we generate. The remaining income (profit) is put back into the EMU to offset incidental fees. The Main Desk and Food Service are also run this way.

These three areas do benefit from the fee-supported areas in the administration of the EMU, such as accounting, payroll and scheduling. So, we are not islands of income but part of a complete unit that provides programs and services to the University.
