CARE sponsors rape issues week

"Freedom From Fear — Rape is everyone's issue" is the theme of Creating A Rape-Free Environment week, which begins Monday.

The weeklong series is the culmination of this term's CARE class. The class is devoted to studying and, more importantly, changing the social climate that contributes to violence against women.

The events, educational displays and presentations throughout campus this week are CARE student term projects.

CARE students Christine Skinner and Michelle Goetze said their projects have helped them to better deal with the reality of rape and violence against women, which is sometimes overwhelming.

"We wanted to dispel some rape myths and promote a community feeling of support and safety," Skinner said.

Throughout the term, Skinner and Goetze said class

members are introduced to the different ways that rape and sexual violence affect everyone, including men, gays and lesbians.

"We are hoping that if we included everyone we'll get more support, recognition and action," Skinner said.

CARE week runs from May 11-15, events include:

- ASUO Street Faire Booth with Men Against Rape and Greeks Against Rape, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.

CARE students will also be setting up display cases at the University bookstore, library and EMU, as well as creating a mural outside the EMU Fishbowl for students to express their feelings and experiences with rape.

The CARE class is available through the department of Educational Policy and Management.

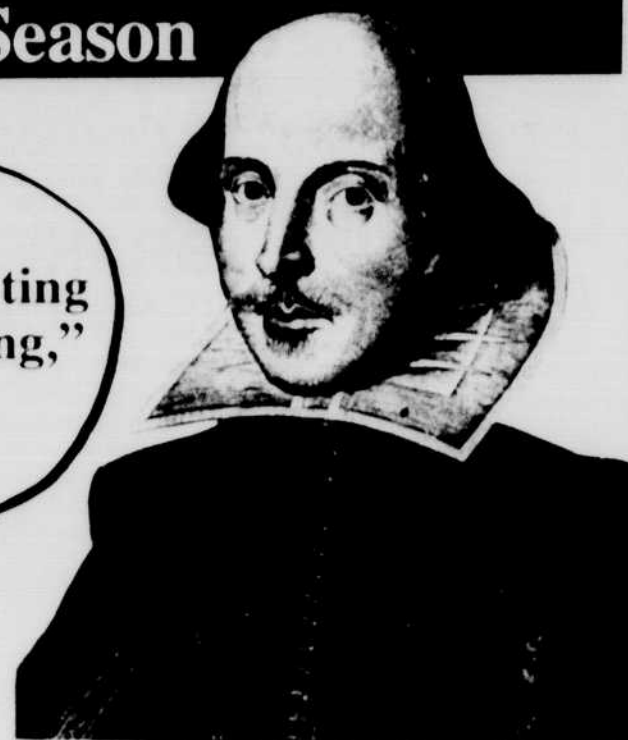
