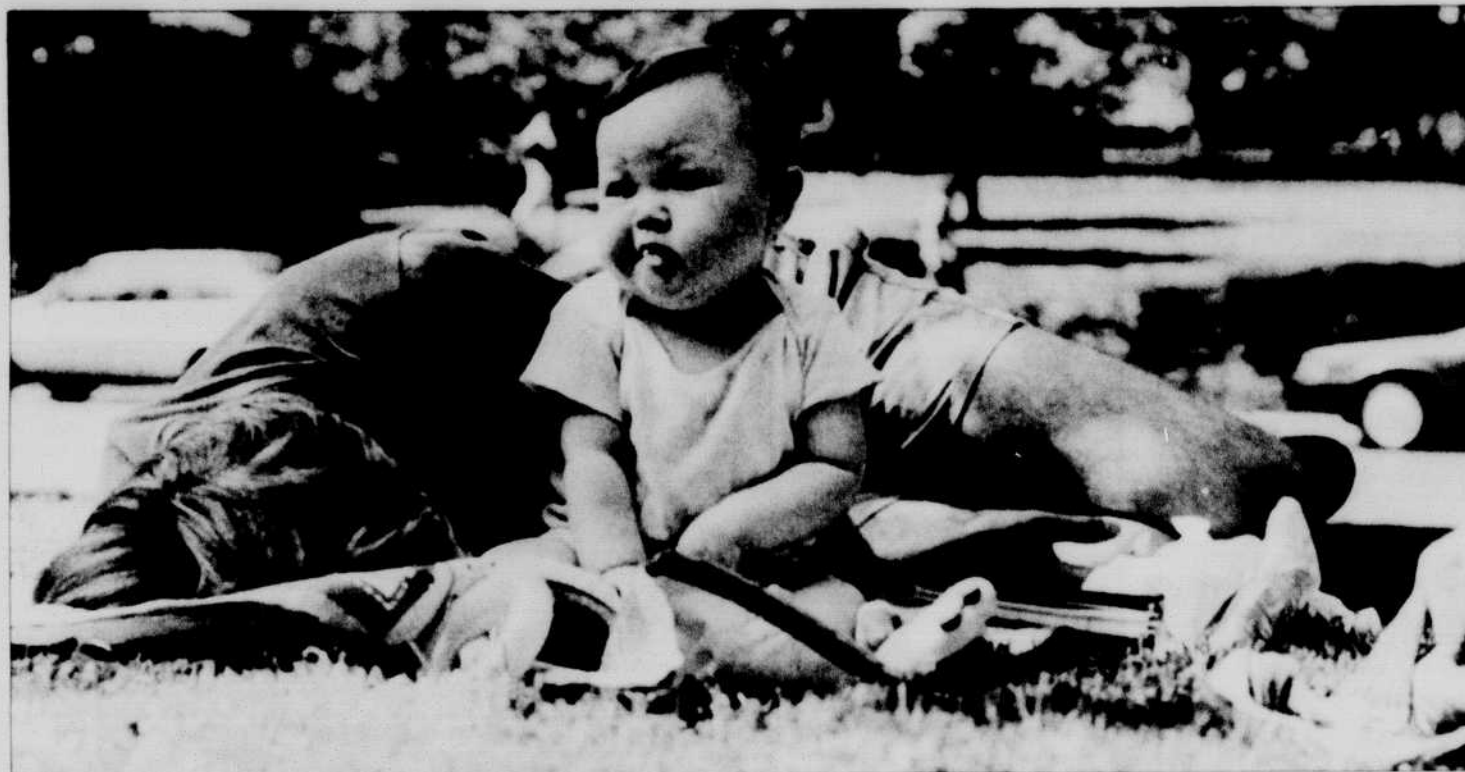

## Defacers face charges

Students who tore down the summer school banner hanging above 13th Avenue will go before the University student-conduct coordinator instead of city authorities, Public Safety Director Carey Drayton said Wednesday.

Because the April 28 incident is still under investigation, the names of those who participated could not be released, Drayton said. As many as four students have been identified so far.

"We're just wrapping it up in a nice, neat package to present to the conduct coordinator," Drayton said.

Conduct Coordinator Elaine Green said any student referred to her office is presumed innocent. The students will present their defense through either an informal process, involving a disciplinary decision from the conduct coordinator, or a formal process, involving a disciplinary decision by a hearings officer.

Disciplinary action can be as little as a reprimand, or as great as an expulsion. Green said in this case, suspension or expulsion is unlikely for a first offender.
