Magic drops hints of NBA comeback

PORTLAND (AP) — Though he won't say for sure, Magic Johnson seems to be inching toward a return to the NBA next season.

He told ESPN earlier in the week that people shouldn't bet against the possibility. On Sunday, after leading the United States to its sixth dominating triumph in the Tournament of the Americas, he repeated the comment.

"Since I don't bet, I was just saying that if you were a betting man, you'd bet that I was coming back," he said after the Americans beat Venezuela 127-80 in the gold medal game.

He insisted, however, that the statement doesn't mean he's

leaning toward returning to the NBA in the fall.

"Everybody has their own opinion about my situation," he said. "I'm going to stick to what I said. I'm going to wait until after the Olympics and decide what to do."

Johnson retired from professional basketball just after the start of last season after he tested positive for the HIV virus that causes AIDS. He told ESPN that he'd been cleared to play about 60 NBA games if he wants to return.

"My wife and I will sit down and talk about it," he said Sunday. "I think she's leaning more toward denying me because before she was against it.

... We'll see what happens."

What's more important now, he said, is the team's play in Barcelona.

"We accomplished what we wanted here," he said. "The big picture is what I'm worried about."

As he did in winning the MVP award in the NBA All-Star Game, Johnson showed in the Olympic qualifying tournament that his skills have not eroded since his retirement.

He started all six U.S. games over an eight-day span and played more than he expected because the team's other point guard, John Stockton, broke a bone in his lower right leg on Monday night.
