CINCINNATI (AP) — General Electric Co. admitted criminal fraud charges Wednesday in the sale of military jet engines to Israel and agreed to pay \$69 million in a settlement.

The company was accused of defrauding the Pentagon and the Israeli Defense Ministry by filing more than \$40 million in false claims in civil charges. It was allowed to plead guilty to criminal charges of defrauding the federal government of \$26.5 million.

Prosecutors also alleged that GE gave Israeli air force Gen. Rami Dotan \$7.9 million to influence decisions on fighter jet engine contracts.

They are charged with one count each of conspiracy, submitting false claims, money laundering and failure to keep accurate accounting rec-

Brian Rowe, chief executive officer of GE's aircraft engines division in suburban Evendale, entered GE's guilty plea. He said the company accepied responsibility for the actions of its em-

As part of the deal, GE will pay \$59.5 million to settle a U.S. Justice Department suit against the company. U.S. District Judge Carl Rubin also imposed a \$9.5 million fine.

The Justice Department, which took over a whistleblower lawsuit brought by a GE employee, originally had asked for triple damages of \$120 million.

The case was the largest prosecuted in the government's foreign military aid program, U.S. Attorney D. Michael Crites said at a news conference. He also said it was the first time a defense contractor was charged under the Money Laundering Control Act of 1986.

Crites said despite the settlement, individuals remained under investigation. He wouldn't iden-

In June, the Pentagon briefly suspended GE's aircraft division from competing for contracts because of the fraud involving Dotan and former GE marketing employee Herbert Steindler.

Roger Witten, a lawyer for GE, said the company had cooperated fully with the government since senior management became aware of the charges in December 1990.

Because the deal fell flat, he'll have to settle for a solo act this summer.


He said he guesses "they forgot about it."
