injuries and released later that night. Two males were held overnight and released the next morning while two females remained in the hospital and were listed in fair condition as of Sept. 10.

Injured were, Chris Millis of Clackamas; Lisa Butler of Oregon City; Rob Williams of Portland; Hector Rios Zovala; Frank Miles of Florence; Arik Hessaldahl of Redmond; Rebecca Brushek of Eugene; and Laurel Kash.

Miles, 22, was held for one night at Sacred Heart with a back injury. Hessaldahl, 21, spent the night in the hospital with fractured ribs and a kidney contusion. Brushek, 23, and Kash, 19, suffered ankle injuries and remained in the hospital.

Birr said paramedics were called to the home of University Life Residence Director Dick Romm at 7:10 p.m. and found "at least" eight people lying on a hillside behind the house. Shortly after 7 p.m., two-thirds of the deck broke away from the rear of the house and fell to the ground. The deck was supported by stilts about 30 feet in the air, Birr said.

Birr said police do not know why the 20-year-old deck collapsed.

But Doug Eveleth, Eugene Building Department director, said inspectors who visited the scene believe extensive dry rot caused the deck to break loose

from the house.

According to witnesses at the accident, there were only about a dozen people on the deck at the time of the collapse, Birr said.

"It just gave way without any readily apparent warning or cause," he said.

Millis, who suffered a crushed vertebra in the fall, said he was heading back into the house from the deck when he felt and saw the deck drop about an inch.

"I told a friend to move back (out of the doorway)," Millis said, "so I could jump into the house. Then it dropped two more inches and people started screaming. I didn't think it was going to go. There was a big crash and everyone was screaming and it was total chaos."

Millis said he tried to jump into the house but the deck suddenly fell out from under him.

"I fell about 30 feet straight down and landed on my feet," he said.

Despite the injuries suffered by the people on the deck, Millis said the accident does have a positive side.

"It was a bonding experience that brought everyone together," he said. "Everyone worked as a team to help each other."

About 65 people were in attendance at the orientation "Reno" night party when the accident occurred. Willis said the residence life staff uses the no-alcohol gathering to get to know other co-workers.
