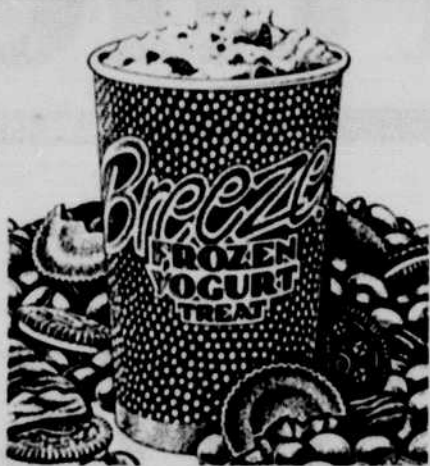

## Monson files suit with University

**Basketball** — Former men's head coach Don Monson is suing the University for more than \$400,000 after being fired last spring.

Monson is seeking \$425,788 that he would have received for the remaining two years on his contract. The lawsuit was filed on July 22 and contends that Monson's dismissal was a breach of contract, which will expire June 30, 1994. The University claims it was not a breach of contract because Monson was not fired, but rather reassigned as coordinator for compliance and eligibility but failed to show up for work.

Monson's contract entitled him to a base salary of \$79,468 a year. Monson is also seeking \$221,066 in endorsement contracts outside the University. Neither Monson nor the University would comment on the lawsuit.

In other hoops news, the Oregon men's basketball team held its awards banquet in early summer.

Antoine Stoudamire was awarded the Steven J. Award for most valuable player. Stoudamire will be a senior this

year after averaging 20 points per game in his first season with the Ducks. Sophomore Orlando Williams received the John Warren Award for most inspirational, John Mitchell was awarded the Harry Ritchie Award for scholar athlete, and the Jessie Nash Award for most improved player went to Chuck Patterson, who graduated.

In addition, head coach Jerry Green added King Rice to his staff as the final assistant coach. Rice played for North Carolina, where he started at point guard for two seasons and was voted most inspirational

player of the Tar Heels' 1990-91 Final Four team.

**Olympics** — A number of former Ducks and Eugene residents competed in the Summer Olympics held in Barcelona, Spain. The top performance turned in by an athlete with ties to Eugene was Kory Tarpenning's fourth place finish in the pole vault.

Among former University athletes who competed were Paula Berry in the javelin, Pedro da Silva in the decathlon, Ken Flax in the hammer, Danny Lopez in the steeplechase, Lisa Ondeiki and Cathy O'Brien in the marathon, and Annette Peters in the 3,000 meters.

Eugene residents who made the trip to Barcelona were Lance Deal in the hammer, Steve Plascencia in the 10,000meters and Shelly Steely in the 3,000 meters.

**Golf** — Steve Nosler was named as Oregon's new men's golf coach. Nosler is the former head of the Oregon Golf Association. He replaces Scott Krieger, who left to be the assistant professional at Broadmoor Golf Course in Portland. Krieger coached at Oregon for eight years before resigning in January.
