The offense lost five of last year's starting crew, including fullback "Touchdown" Tommy Vardell (1,084 yards, 20 TDs) and leading receiver Chris Walsh, (66 catches for 934

Returning is junior Steve Stenstrom, who led the Pac-10 in passing efficiency last season, completing over 60 percent of his passes. Walsh will no doubt get the most out of Stenstrom, which should be enough to keep the Cardinal near the top of the conference.
