## Cultural Forum plans year of music, art, film

The University's student-run Cultural Forum, which sponsors about four or five events a month from September to June, kicks off this year with a performance by two Seattle-based steel guitarists.

Baby Gramps, along with Walker T. Ryan, will perform Saturday, Oct. 3 at 8:30 p.m. at WOW Hall. Tickets are \$6 for University students and \$8 for others and are available at WOW Hall.

He'll be followed later in the month by Scottish folk singer Dougie MacLean in the beginning of what Cultural Forum organizers expect to be a stand-out year.

Although music is always a big part of the Cultural Forum's focus, events in film/video, visual arts, performing arts and even contemporary issues are also part of the plan.

Richard Herranen, regional music coordinator and one of eight students running the Cul-

tural Forum this year, said the decision about what to feature is arrived at by consensus within the group.

"I think throughout the year, it's really going to work out," he said. "We have a sharp crew with some really good ideas."

Herranen said Cultural Forum members look for "cultural diversity" in what they present and try give people something refreshing and different.

In addition to concerts and exhibits, the Cultural Forum organizes Friday's Beer Garden, which runs from 4 to 7 p.m. in the EMU Fountain Court and features live bands. Free chips and salsa will still be offered from 4 to 5, but Eric Peterson, regional music coordinator, said there may be fewer Beer Gardens this year — probably two or three a month — but they plan to feature better entertainment from more well-known local bands.

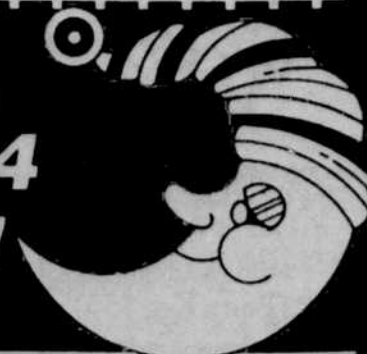
