

# Feasts for the eyes abound around town

As an escape from the rain and books, Eugene's museums and galleries offer a cultural retreat ranging from cow skin furniture to Japanese bombers to galactic disasters. The following is a list of some local museums and galleries and their current exhibits.

### University Art Museum—

The museum is located on the main lawn near the Knight library and has one of the most extensive Asian art collections on the West coast. In addition to the Asian art and the Rodin sculptures on loan from Stanford University, the museum features 90 works by 59 Oregon artists in the "Oregon Biennial 1991" traveling exhibit. Three of the pieces in the exhibit were chosen for Jurors' prizes, including University Fine Arts Professor Margaret Prentice's etching titled "Primal Time." The museum is open Wednesday through Sunday from 12-5.

### University Museum of Natural History—

Located at the corner of 15th Avenue and Agate Street and daunting a large Chinook salmon on its facade, the museum focuses on archaeology, natural history, and cultural anthropology.

"500 Years of Resistance; Threads of Continuity in Guatemala and Mexico" is an exten-

sive seven-month exhibit that began Sept. 16.

Four exhibits, local and international guest speakers, performances, celebrations, workshops, and a planetarium show celebrate the traditions of Latin America. The project explores the varying levels of cultural resistance to foreign domination by Nahu and Maya Indians. The series of exhibits are "Threads of Continuity, Threads of Change: Costumes as Communication in Highland Guatemala"; "Death and Fiesta: Day of the Dead in Oaxaca, Mexico"; and "The Color of Tradition: Indigenous Women of Mexico and Guatemala." The museum is open Wednesday through Sunday from 12-5.

### Laverne Krause Gallery—

Located on the first floor of Lawrence Hall, the campus art gallery provides an opportunity for students to show their works. The exhibits rotate once a week and early this fall, the gallery will feature artwork by the faculty and students. Call the Fine and Applied Arts office for time and dates at 346-3610.

### Jacob's Gallery—

The gallery is on the ground floor of the Hult Center for the Performing Arts and will be open late on weekends for the Mayor's Art Show exhibit until Oct. 31. More than 50 works by

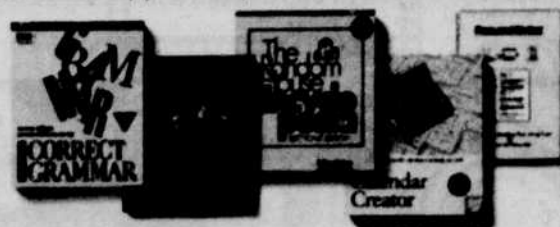
