Campbell Club offers learning experience

□ Co-op teaches residents how to live and work as a community

When the 21-year-old student first walked into the towering Campbell Club on Alder street, he found more than just shelter. He found a community.

And it is that sense of community that has kept political science major John Flanery living in the Campbell Club, located at 1670 Alder.

"This is a community for both sexes," Flanery said. "This is a place for people who are willing to take responsibility for their lives, and at the same time rely on other people."

Flanery said much of life today lacks community, which he thinks is an important part of being human.

"So much of society is alienating — living alone in an

apartment, going to your job day after day. What sort of life is that? What are you here for?"

Flanery lives with approximately 34 other students in the 27-room Campbell Club, and shares in the duties of maintaining the house.

All residents have their own personal responsibilities, which can range from cleaning and cooking, to planning the budget or tending the garden.

Each duty has an amount of points assigned, which are accumulated during the week until a certain amount is reached. Flanery said the duties usually average up to an hour a day.

Besides doing their weekly duties, the inhabitants also meet weekly to vote and rule on events from upcoming events to house policies, such as their new plan to make the house handicapped-accessible.

Flanery said undertaking tasks such as balancing budgets and planning meals teaches
