Mehretab declined to comment. Hoop said he was happy with how things turned out but had no other comment.

The violence at the Federal Building followed a rally in the EMU Courtyard where students expressed outrage over the not-guilty verdicts of the policemen accused in connection with the much-publicized videotaped beating of King.

The rally moved to the Federal Building, where protesters did \$6,131 worth of damage by breaking 15 windows and two doors.

Hoop, a student senator, was arrested outside a Senate meeting May 13 by Eugene police. Arias turned himself in at the federal courthouse the next day.

Hoop was originally denied bail after prosecutor Deborah Dealy-Browning, an assistant U.S. attorney, presented Federal Magistrate Tom Coffin an article in the March issue of the *Oregon Voice* that attributed Hoop with saying after graduation he would "probably get involved with a political group and blow up buildings."

Coffin released Hoop May 14 after he and Arias entered the not-guilty pleas.

Following further investigation by the Eugene office of the FBI, Mehretab was indicted June 11 and turned himself in at the federal courthouse June 16. He was released the same day.

Videotaped footage of the April 30 protest at the federal Building was broadcast on two local television stations, and a photograph of Hoop kicking in a window during the rally appeared on the front page of the *Register-Guard*. Ray said the videotape and photo probably would have been used against Hoop and Arias if the case had gone to trial.

In a prepared statement, the U.S. Attorney's office said the FBI is continuing its investigation into "the other individuals causing damage to the Federal Building during the April 30 demonstration."
