Brooks makes staff changes

Rich Brooks wasted no time making his mark on the athletic department.

Brooks, who took over as Director of Athletics Thursday, announced several organizational changes.

Barbara Walker, associate athletic director, has been assigned the additional duties of monitoring and interpreting NCAA and Pacific-10 Conference business.

Gary Gray will be put in charge of all duties in the compliance area. He previously shared that position with Roberts. Gray will also continue his duties as director of student services/academic coordinator until Oregon conducts a search for a new academic coordinator next July.

Associate athletic director Ken Winstead will be in charge of all fund-raising efforts and will no longer supervise the athletic ticket office and department of broadcasting and market/promotions.

Senior associate director Sandy Walton will now oversee the ticket office, and Neil Zoumboukos, who is an assis-tant football coach under Brooks, will be in charge of the maintenance and operations staff.

"After discussions with our staff and the careful examination of their abilities," Brooks said in a press release issued by Oregon's sports information office, "I felt this was the most efficient way to realign our department.

In addition, assistant athletic director/media service Steve Hellyer will assist in the broadcasting and marketing/promotions offices and take over scheduling in football. He and Dave Heeke, director of broadcasting and marketing/promotions, will report directly to the athletic director.

Dave Thurkill, formerly recruiting coordinator, has been reassigned to the office of student services/academic coordinator until the end of the academic year.

Syracuse slapped for NCAA violations

SYRACUSE, N.Y. (AP) - The long-awaited NCAA sanctions against the Syracuse basketball program came down Thursday, lighter than expected because of the school's cooperation in the investigation.

The Orangemen are banned from 1992-93 postseason play and the school's entire athletic program was placed on two years' probation as violations were also found in the women's basketball, football, lacrosse and wrestling programs.

The NCAA said the penalties were less than the minimum for major violations because of Syracuse's cooperation in its probe. The NCAA Committee on Infractions stopped short of banning Syracuse from live television appearances, but did assess scholarship and recruiting penalties.

Basketball coach Jim Boeheim said his players were disappointed when told of the penalties Thursday morning.

has been to the last three tournaments and they're going to have to accept it. There are a lot of kids, a majority of kids, who go to college and don't get to go to three NCAA tournaments," he said.

Syracuse is the first member of the high-profile Big East basketball conference to be sanctioned by the NCAA.

The Infractions Committee determined "there were repeated and conscious efforts by representatives of the university's athletic interests to gain recruiting and competitive advantages for the men's basketball program."

As a result, Syracuse loses a scholarship in 1993-94 and 1994-95.

In addition, the NCAA banned the men's basketball coaches from off-campus recruiting from Jan. 1-June 30, 1993. For the rest of the year, only one coach at a time will be allowed to recruit off campus.
