Other University religious leaders are taking public stands on Measure 9.

Although the Baptist Student Union does not have an official position on Measure 9, Director James Sanders said he presently plans to vote yes on the measure.

"If I had to vote today, I'd more than likely vote for Measure 9," Sanders said. "I believe homosexuality is a choice people make, and it is not deserving of minority status."

Several University religious leaders strongly oppose Measure 9. The Rev. Tiare Mathison-Bowie of the Presbyterian Campus Ministry said Measure 9 is a civil rights issue.

"This issue is not a theological one," Mathison-Bowie said. "The issue is whether civil rights can be extended to gay men and lesbians."

Mathison-Bowie said she is angered by OCA statements in support of Measure 9.

There are five or six verses about sexual orientation in the Bible," Mathison-Bowie said. "There is so much distortion in what the OCA says that I don't think we're reading the same Bible.

Rev. Janet Cromwell, United Methodist campus pastor, said her organization is working hard to defeat Measure 9.


"We see this as a matter of equal rights and justice for all people," Cromwell said. "We live in a pluralistic society; therefore, it is inappropriate to have a handful of scripture passages placed in state law.

In a joint statement, Hillel and the Jewish Student Union said Measure 9 legalized discrimination.
