Measure fattens up Voters' Pamphlet

(AP) — The state Voters' Pamphlet might be more appropriately named "Voters' Volume."

This year's pamphlet contains 68 perspectives on Measure 9 — 10 for and 58 against — and will total 34 pages of the approximately 200-page booklet.

Nearly every segment of Oregon society is represented: religious, business, labor, legal, political and gay-rights perspectives.

The apparent record number of submitted statements indicates the intensity of debate over the measure that has transformed Oregon into a national battleground over the issue of gay rights.

Measure 9, which would amend the state constitution to declare homosexuality "abnormal" and "perverse," would require state government, including schools, to discourage homosexuality.

Under Oregon law, the state Elections Division is required to publish every statement from any individual or group willing to pay the \$300 fee or gather 1,000 signatures of registered voters. In the case of Measure 9, all parties opted to fork over the cash.

The only restrictions: entries

can be no longer than 350 words and cannot be slanderous or libelous, said Elections Division Director Colleen Sealock.


Though the number of statements on Measure 9 is an apparent record, both opponents and supporters say there easily could have been twice as many if they had not worked to keep the number down.


Lon Mabon, director of the Oregon Citizens Alliance, which is sponsoring the measure, says more than two dozen organizations and individuals offered to submit statements in support of the initiative.

Mabon says he's not worried about the mismatch between the number of statements offered by supporters and opponents of the measure. "Most are going to read two or three until they get the picture, and then they'll stop," he said.

Statements in support of Measure 9 include an entry by OCA Political Director Phillip Ramsdell.

"Despite the glaring truth about the homosexual lifestyle, some Oregon public schools are teaching children that homosexuality is a good and normal choice," Ramsdell concludes. "No one gave public officials this authority."
