### Oregon assistant does it all

When Oregon athletic director Rich Brooks recently announced his department was being reshuffled, it was nothing new to Neal Zoumboukos, Oregon's jack of all trades.

Officially, Zoumboukos is an assistant head coach and offensive line coach for the Duck football team, but he does much more than that. He oversees the team's travel, budgets and walk-on program, as well as his new job supervising the maintenance and operations

"When coach Brooks became athletic director, he asked me to take some additional duties," Zoumboukos said. "I told him I would help him in any way possible. My new role is basically to be the complaint center. When there are differences

within the operations of our facilities, I will try to settle

"Neal Zoumboukos is naturally aware of who is using our various facilities on a day-to-day basis and possesses outstanding administrative skills from being my assistant head coach," Brooks said. "He is able to observe what the needs are firsthand."

Two years ago Brooks elevated Zoumboukos to assistant head coach - a role that requires him to set up the team's travel schedule and budget, among other things.

"I take care of the budget and travel for the team," Zoumboukos said. "This enables coach Brooks to look after the student-athlete instead of worrying about where the paper clips are."

When he finally gets around to coaching, Zoumboukos says he is happy with the way his offensive line is coming togeth-


er.
