

Golf team struggles in Seattle

The Oregon men's golf team struggled in its first tournament of the season, finishing ninth at the Husky Classic in Seattle on Tuesday.

The Ducks were in fifth place after posting a 298 in the first round, but disaster struck during Monday's second round. The Ducks fired a 34-over-par, 314, the worst one-round team score of the tournament. Oregon rebounded by posting a 287 on Tuesday, the third-best total for the round.

Individually the Ducks were led by senior Jeff Lyons with a 10-over-par 220, giving him a tie for 14th place. Lyons' play was typical of the Ducks, shoot-

ing a combined one-over during the first and last rounds, and a 79 in the second round, killing his chances of winning the tournament. Lyons finished the tournament with a 69, the fourth-best round of the day.

Cam Martin, a senior who redshirted last year, finished in a tie for 22nd, three shots behind Lyons.

The University of Southern California won the team title with a final round of 287 for an overall score of 872 on the par-70 Broadmoor Country Club in Seattle.

Steve Burdick of Stanford won the individual title with a 213, including a final round of 68, which tied the lowest score of the tournament.

Oregon finished last of the

seven Pacific-10 Conference teams in the field. Besides the Ducks, Stanford and USC, other conference teams at the tournament were Washington State, Oregon State and two teams from the host school, Washington.

The Ducks have little time to think about the tournament as they are back in action Oct. 14-15 in the Robertson-Holmes Collegiate at Stockton, Calif.

The Ducks received some bad news last week when it was announced that Doug DuChateau's eligibility has expired. Oregon was previously told he would be allowed to compete during the fall season, but that decision was overruled.

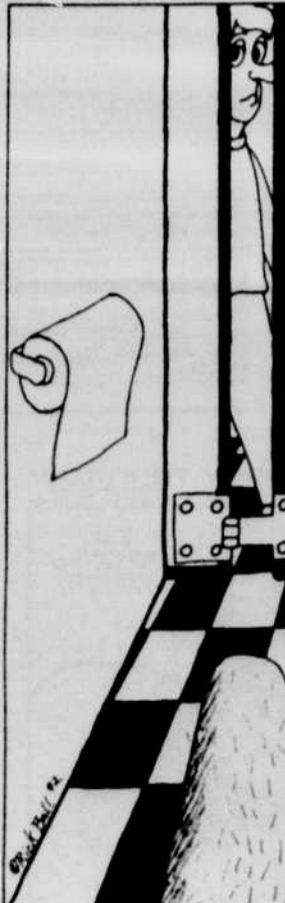
