

## Pac-10 offers national showdowns

Two games in the Pacific-10 Conference this week feature a pair of nationally ranked teams squaring off. That's not surprising considering the Pac-10 has five teams in this week's Associated Press Top 25.

The biggest game of the week pits No. 1-ranked Washington and No. 24 California. Washington is 2-0 in the conference after beating USC 17-10 last week in Seattle.

California's only setback this season came against Purdue early in the season. Last week's slaughtering of Oregon State has them at 1-0 in the conference. Cal is at home, and Washington quarterback Billy Joe Hobert is not happy splitting time with Mark Brunell.

Remember this, if the Huskies win, they'll come to Autzen next weekend ranked No. 1 in the nation.

**Pick: Washington 24 California 16.**

In the other nationally ranked showdown, 11th-ranked

Stanford will take on 19th-ranked UCLA in Los Angeles. Since its early-season loss to Texas A&M to open the season, Stanford has played flawless football. They have won four straight, including a huge win over Notre Dame last week.

UCLA was crushed by Arizona last week, but the 3-1 Bruins believe this will be the game that gets them back on track. Guess Again.

**Pick: Stanford 31 UCLA 20.**

The other ranked team, USC, plays the Ducks this weekend. The 20th-ranked Trojans have yet to play a home game this season, and have gone 1-1-1 in their first three games. USC gave the Huskies a run for their money last weekend, which could be a confidence builder.

Oregon is playing its best football since the Bill Musgrave era, winning three straight. But the Ducks have won only one of their last 21 meetings with the Trojans. Oregon is ranked

No. 22 by the *New York Times* computer poll — which, by the way, is not prone to human error (wink wink). The Ducks received one vote from the Associated Press, which is all the votes they got in the *Emerald* office.

**Pick: USC 17 Oregon 7.**

How 'bout that option. The last two weeks, Oregon State has been kicked in the teeth by reality, getting crushed by Utah and California. Washington State will travel to Corvallis to see what it can do against the Beavers lackluster defense. The Cougars just missed the top 25, and are undefeated with NFL-bound quarterback Drew Bledsoe leading the way.

**Pick: Washington State 49 Oregon State 6.**

## Husky tickets gone

If you planned on going to see Oregon play No. 1 ranked Washington on Oct. 17 but haven't picked up your student ticket yet, you're too late.

The McArthur Court and Casanova Center ticket offices handed out the final student tickets for the game Wednesday. Tickets were made available on Monday.

Reserved seating and general admission tickets for the game sold out this summer. The athletic department made available another 2,200 general admission tickets on

Sept. 29, but those sold out soon after they went on sale.

Standing room tickets will go on sale Monday for \$14.

A near-record crowd is expected for the game. The last time Washington came to Autzen Stadium, the game drew the second-largest attendance in Oregon history. The game was also the last time the Ducks defeated the Huskies.

The Huskies are currently 4-0 and the Ducks are 3-2 going into their game this weekend at USC.

## Atlanta wins, goes up 2-0
