Bo Adan, co-coordinator of the rally, said the Hollywood Women's Political Committee offered to help on the financial side and that "we just needed people power."

"I said, 'Let's do something really big,'" Adan said.

John Pollock, co-coordinator of the event, said the other actors will also try to push students into going to the polls, a message he said is essential for students to become part of politics.

"I want students to get inspired to get involved in the political process," Pollock said, "and the way to do that is to get registered to vote."

Pollock, who is also president of the College Democrats, said five voter registration booths will be set up at the rally to try and lure unregistered students. A number of other student groups will also have booths set up at the rally.

Adan said he and others will race down to the Lane County Courthouse before the 5 p.m. deadline with boxes of these voter registration cards in hand.

Pollock said he hopes to draw between 3,000 and 5,000 people to today's event. He said he would be happy if 1,000 more people registered on the final day, which would add to the ASUO's tally of 4,000 registered to date.

Since the spring primaries, Pollock and the College Demo-

crats registered about 700 voters on their own, he said.

Similar rallies in past weeks netted huge turnouts at the University of Colorado and the University of Washington, Adan said.

Adan said the Colorado event, which featured singer Michelle Shocked, attracted 10,000 people, and a combination of Democratic vice presidential candidate Al Gore and the Lovemongers — which features members of the rock group Heart — brought out 12,000 people. Nearly 700 students were registered at the Washington rally, he said.
