Announcement of Graduate Teaching Fellowship for the Carlton Raymond and Wilberta Ripley Savage Professorship in International Relations and Peace

The committee that selects the distinguished Carlton Raymond and Wilberta Ripley Savage Professor in International Relations and Peace is pleased to announce an opening for a Graduate Teaching Fellow (GTF) to assist the 1992-93 professor, Winona LaDuke.

Winona LaDuke is an Anishinabeg (Ojibwe) Native from the White Earth Reservation in White Earth, Minnesota. She is a graduate of Harvard and holds a master's degree in rural development from Antioch College. Currently, she is the director of the White Earth Land Recovery Project and is well known as an environmental activist. In March, LaDuke visited the University of Oregon as one of the keynote speakers for the 1992 Environmental Law Conference. LaDuke is president of the Aboriginal Women's Network.

The GTF will assist LaDuke in teaching two courses during the spring term of 1993, consisting of a large undergraduate class tentatively titled "Indigenous Human Rights: A Woman's Perspective" and a smaller graduate seminar focusing on indigenous economics. The GTF will also work with the Savage Professorship Committee and its chair during winter term 1993 in preparing for LaDuke's teaching during the spring. The GTF position may be appointed at a .20 FTE for the winter, a possible .40 for the spring, and .20 for the summer.

Candidates should be enrolled as a graduate student at the University of Oregon in a field related to LaDuke's courses and expertise such as anthropology; history; economics; education; environmental studies; geography; folklore and ethnic studies; international studies; peace studies; planning; public policy and management; political science; sociology; and women's studies. Candidates should have a strong interest in human rights issues, indigenous people and economics, and women's issues on an international scale. They should also possess strong cross-cultural communication, organizational, and writing skills.

Those interested in applying should submit a current vita, two letters of reference, and a short essay indicating why you would like to work with Winona LaDuke. Applications should be submitted to the Office of International Affairs, 221 Johnson Hall (attention Lynn Buffing, 346-2167) no later than November 16, 1992.
