office is currently requesting clarification about the BARF from the OSBHE office.

"It was our intent all along that it would be charged to both the MSIR and MBA programs," Spradling said. "We're waiting for the final answer from the chancellor's office."

Spradling said he can't predict what the chancellor's office will decide about the BARF, but he hopes to have an answer within a week.

The CBA is using the BARF to raise about \$118,000 for the Graduate Career Services Center and the Chiles Center Computer Lab, Terborg said. About 58 MSIR students and 192 MBA students attend the University.

Although the MSIR is an interdisciplinary program in the

University's Graduate School and is not a CBA program, Terborg said the CBA has good reasons for charging MSIR students the BARF.

"In some ways you can argue that the MSIR program is not a College of Business program, but functionally it is," Terborg said.

Terborg said the CBA reviews the applications of all MSIR students, and MSIR and MBA students have equal access to classes and the career and computer centers.

Most students have accepted the new fee, Terborg said.

"Most people seem to approve or go along with it," Terborg said. "Only a clear minority oppose it."

All of the MSIR students contacted by the *Oregon Daily Emerald* declined to comment about the BARF.

rights," he said.

Wixman said another reason for making the tape, which he is doing for free, is to teach the Soviets that not everyone in America is democratic. He likened members of the OCA to historical American Christian fundamentalists.

"In America, Christian fundamentalists as exemplified by the OCA and other related organizations doesn't represent traditional American democratic views," he said. "These groups were always opposed to democracy."

Wixman, a self-labeled "model conservative" on campus, said his objection to the OCA does not stem from "liberal" views, but from very strong conservative, democratic and American traditional views.

"The OCA functions and uses the methodology used by Lenin and Hitler, which is to take quotes out of context and mislabeling in the name of morality," he said.

This is Wixman's fourth broadcast on "Voice of America." He also did one broadcast on "Radio Liberty." All shows have to do with national affairs and issues of democracy.
