



Former Duck McChesney dies

Former Oregon track star Bill McChesney died last Thursday afternoon in a car accident on Highway 20 near Newport.

McChesney, 33, was one of the top runners in Oregon history. He set still-standing Oregon school records in the 5,000- and 10,000-meters. McChesney competed for the

Ducks from 1980 to 1982.

Traveling westbound about 3 p.m., McChesney's truck crossed the center line, spun out of control and collided with a delivery truck. The driver of the delivery truck, Donald Lee Crouser, suffered a broken leg.

McChesney attended South Eugene High School and was

recruited heavily out of high school. He made the 1980 U.S. Olympic team but was unable to compete that year because of the U.S. boycott.

McChesney is survived by his wife, Nancy; his parents, William and Marcia McChesney; and his brothers, Steve and Ken. Another brother, Tom, was also killed in a car accident in 1986.

The funeral will be Tuesday at 1 p.m. at Central Lutheran Church, 1857 Potter St.
