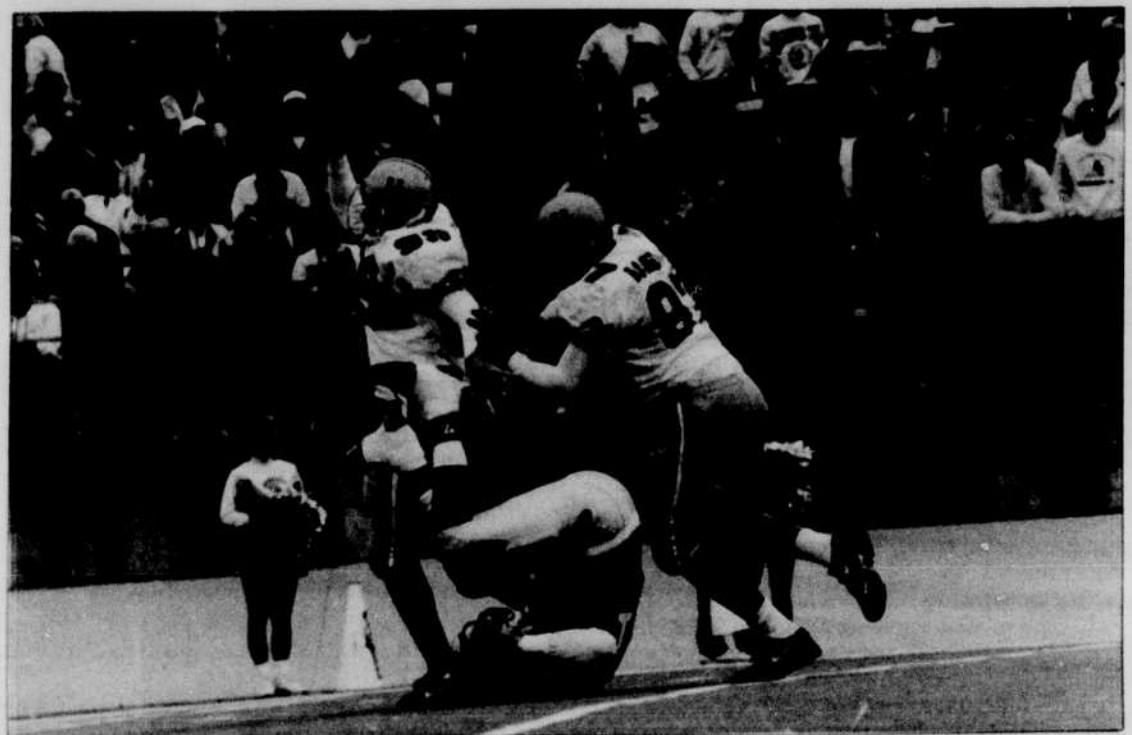

Ducks embarrass Cougs, 34-17

The Ducks stole a page out of George Bush's book of comebacks on Saturday.

Just when it looked as if the Oregon football team's year was over, it rebounded to upset 19th-ranked Washington State 34-17 in Pullman, keeping a glimmer of hope alive before heading into the final run of the Pacific-10 Conference season.

Oregon's year has been marked by streaks. The team opened the season

with two losses, bounced back to win three straight, and then lost two more. The Ducks, 4-4 overall and 2-3 in the Pac-10, are hoping Saturday's win will be the start of a season-closing four-game winning streak that could get them a shot at post-season play.

With two home games remaining, against California and UCLA, and a trip to Corvallis for the Civil War, a 7-4 record is not out of Oregon's reach.

The Ducks' performance against the Cougars is a model of what Oregon will need to do

if it hopes to finish in the top half of the Pac-10: play strong defense, and, more importantly, hold on to the football.

The Ducks made only one turnover and had three takeaways, and Oregon's defense sacked Washington State quarterback Drew Bledsoe six times and allowed only 217 yards in total offense.

As has been the case in most of Oregon's victories this season, kicker/punter Tommy Thompson played an important
