Noon rally to provide time to vent feelings

University students will have a chance to voice the anger or happiness they feel in response to the election results today at a noon rally in the EMU Courtyard.

Troy Shields, co-director of the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual Alliance, said the rally will focus on student reaction to the results of Ballot Measure 9.

"It's for people to celebrate or mourn together in a non-violent way," Shields said. "Whether (Measure 9) passes or not, someone will be hurt."

The rally will include speakers, music and information booths, Shields said. No open microphone will be available.

Speakers at the rally will include Shields; Marlene Drescher, director of the Office of Student Advocacy; Tiare Mathison-Bowie, campus minister of the Presbyterian Campus Ministry; Sally Bryan, minister of the Unitarian Church; and Dom Vetri, University law professor.

Caitlin Twain, ASUO safety

affairs coordinator, said she and other rally organizers obtained a parade permit in case people "need to move."

The University Office of Public Safety, Eugene police department and Eugene Peacekeepers will have representatives at the rally to prevent people from venting their emotions with violence.

The rally was designed to give students a peaceful means to vent their reaction to the election results, Twain said.

"We've decided we need a way to focus the students' energy, which may not be good energy," Twain said. "We're banking on a large number of students showing up."

"Particularly if there is a 'yes' vote on 9, we can expect there is going to be a large number of angry people needing to group together for support," she said.

The Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual Alliance, ASUO, Dean of Students Office, Women's Center and University Committee on Lesbian, Gay and Bisexual Concerns are sponsoring the rally.

Bean poll picks Clinton

A jar full of beans predicted Bill Clinton's election as the next president of the United States.

The ASUO conducted a "bean poll" at Friday's election fair in the EMU. Passers-by were encouraged to drop a bean in the jar of the candidate or ballot measure of their choice.

"We wanted to see if student tallies match up with the election results," said Chris Bauman, ASUO events coordinator. "Using beans was a lot of fun, and we think it turned out well."

Bauman said about 200 students took part in the bean ballot.

In other poll results, U.S. Senate candidate Les AuCoin collected more beans than incumbent Bob Packwood, and Mary Burrows edged out Ruth Bascom for mayor of Eugene.

Ballot Measure 9 was buried under an avalanche of "no" beans.
