years with Minnesota and Atlanta in the NFL.

Shaw was Oregon's first two-sport athlete, competing in football and baseball for the Ducks.

"Berry was the smartest quarterback I ever had," Casanova said. "He was tough and could come through in the clutch. George Shaw was a fine passer. He did a great job and had great speed."

Mel Renfro, one of the greatest athletes in Oregon history, also played under Casanova and will be inducted in the original class. Renfro played both offense and defense in football, as well as track for the Ducks from 1961-63.

Another one of Oregon's great quarterbacks, Norm Van Brocklin, will be among the first class of inductees. Van Brocklin was Oregon's first All-American quarterback, as he passed for 1,949 yards and 18 touchdowns during his two-year career. Van Brocklin is also in the NFL Hall of Fame after leading the Vikings and L.A. Rams to their only league championships ever.

Six former Oregon track stars and two coaches will be in the first class inducted into the new hall, including one of the Ducks' most popular athletes ever, Steve Prefontaine.

Prefontaine set two American prep records and won four NCAA 5,000-meter titles to go along with three cross country champi-

onships. He finished fourth in the 1972 Olympics and seemed certain to better that mark in 1976 until an automobile accident killed him in 1975.

Former Oregon track coaches Bill Bowerman and Bill Hayward will also be honored this weekend. Hayward was hired in 1904, and his teams dominated Northwest track into the 1940s.

Bowerman's teams won four NCAA Championships, and he retired as the winningest coach in school history. His 1962 squad is one of three teams that will be inducted into the Hall.

Ronnie Lee, who led the 1973-76 Duck basketball squad known as the "Kamikaze Kids," is one of four basketball players who will be inducted this weekend. Lee is the only Duck player in history to score more than 2,000 points and led Oregon to the National Invitational Tournament twice in the 1970s. Lee was a three-time All-American selection and a four-time all-league performer.

Oregon's 1939 basketball team, the NCAA's first-ever college basketball champions, are one of the three teams to be honored this weekend. "The Tall Firs," as they were called, went 29-5 during the season and beat Ohio State 46-33 in the title game. The team's coach, Howard Hobson, will also be inducted.

Others to be inducted include: Otis Davis (track), 1956-58; Dan Kelly (track), 1906-08; Les Steers (track), 1940-41; Jerry Tarr (track), 1960-62; Mac Wilkins (track), 1970-73; Ed Durno (basketball), 1919-21; Lynne Winbigler (track), 1973-75; Charlie Warren (basketball), 1959-62; Bev Smith (basketball), 1978-82; John Beckett (football), 1913-16; Dick James (football), 1952-54; John Kitzmiller (football), 1928-30; Joe Gordon (baseball), 1933-35; John Miller (wrestling), 1968-70; and Oregon's 1916-17 Rose Bowl champions.

The inductions will be at a banquet tonight. The Hall of Fame will include plaques of all inductees and will be located in the Casanova Center's Hall of Champions.

Hellyer said Oregon plans to induct five new members into the Hall each year.
