with four minutes left in the first quarter when he fielded a punt at the Oregon 30-yard line and returned it 64 yards to the California six-yard line. Oregon fullback Juan Shedrick scored on the next play, running six yards for the touchdown.

"I don't know if their coverage was that bad or we were that good," Harris said. "You would have to ask the blockers that. But for the most part the blockers were doing a great job, and they made my job easy today."

A California field goal cut the lead to 14-10, but Oregon running back Ricky Whittle gave the Ducks an 11-point lead when he burst through a hole up the middle and ran 80 yards for a touchdown.

"The middle linebacker was over the center, but then they shifted," Whittle said. "I knew I could get through and would only have to break a tackle or two. Their shift helped us, and they didn't do it again all day."

Whittle's run was the longest for the Ducks in seven years and helped boost the stats on a day when Oregon struggled against California's eight-man front line. The Ducks totaled 190 yards on 43 rushes, with Whittle accounting for 129 of them.

Junior tailback Burwell regained his starting spot for the Ducks but never got into the flow of the game, finishing with only 17 yards on 14 carries.

The game stayed at 21-10 until early in the third quarter when White ran 17 yards for a touchdown to get the Bears close again. White renewed his campaign for the Heisman Tro-

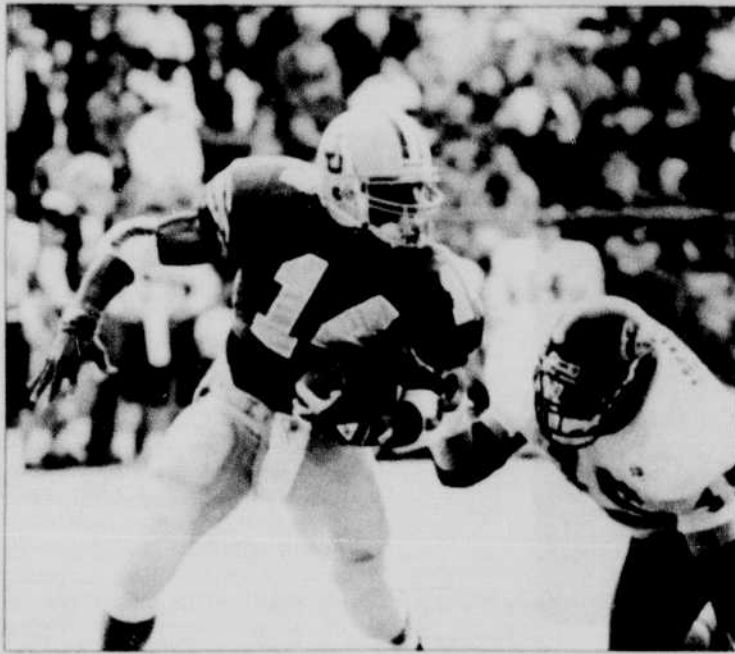

phy on Saturday with 192 yards and two touchdowns on 29 carries.

Although the Ducks couldn't stop White, they did shut down Sean Dawkins, Cal's All-American candidate at wide receiver. Dawkins caught only three passes for 68 yards.

"We did a great job on Dawkins," Brooks said. "We mixed it up on him; our coaches did a great job getting the team prepared."

"They had two men on me at all times," Dawkins said. "Every play their free safety ran toward me. That was the best coverage I've faced all year."

Oregon's biggest hero on defense was sophomore cornerback Herman O'Berry, who intercepted Cal quarterback Dave Barr three times. O'Berry's first

interception ended a Cal drive and scoring opportunity in the first quarter when Barr under-threw Dawkins in the end zone.

"If the ball is outside, I would have got it," Dawkins said. "O'Berry is 5-10 and didn't even have to jump."

"They were coming my way all day," O'Berry said. "I felt like they were after me all day, and if they were, I thank them."

After a 47-yard field goal by Thompson, the Ducks began to put the game away when quarterback Danny O'Neil hit Harris on a post pattern for a 56-yard touchdown to stretch the lead to 31-17 after three quarters. O'Neil had a quiet game for the Ducks, completing 11 passes in 20 attempts for one touchdown.
