ple to ride bikes in the sunshine, but he hopes the bike shelters will give more incentive to ride when it is raining because bikes will be locked in dry spots.

The Bicycle Plan is coming to a finish as the user group has almost used its \$400,000 budget, which funded such things as an additional 2,500 new spaces for bikes, the installation of the new wave-type bike racks, and bike route and path construction.

The funds for the improvement plan come from the Office of Public Safety's Parking Program, which generates money from parking meters, parking permits and citations.

"Students, by and large, aren't paying for the shelters," Tepfer said. "Faculty and staff are buying the parking permits; most students don't have cars. This is not coming out of students' tuition."

The first seven shelters will provide an additional 200 spaces for bikes and will include lamp-posts outside of the structures.

The user group plans to have more bike shelters built in the spring.

The University hired two private design firms and a private construction company to build the shelters.

Tepfer said the idea of bike shelters are catching the interest of colleges and universities across the country. He said he receives at least one call a month from another university asking him about the shelters and The Bicycle Program.
