business income tax.

Hornbuckle said a hotel room tax might be a good idea, but it would need to be countywide. Otherwise, he said, "people might go to Springfield to stay instead of Eugene."

Bascom mentioned the possibility of a gas tax, which would be decided by the council and not put before voters.

"We might do a gas tax, but that money would be designated just to roads, streets and general highway funds," Bascom said. She said the gas tax revenue would not be applied to the general fund.

Other options to make up the \$3.8 million shortfall previously thought to be covered by the restaurant tax include more spending cuts.

Hornbuckle said that these cuts could be made in the city attorney's office and the Riverfront Research Park.

The city currently contracts with a corporate law firm, Hornbuckle said. He said the city may look into hiring its own attorney or attorneys to cut costs.

Hornbuckle also said that although the current construction on the Riverfront Research Park should continue, "it's fiscally irresponsible to continue city participation. The return to the city is non-existent at this point."

Bascom said user fee increases and deeper cuts in the capital improvement budget might also help in raising the \$3.8 million.

"There's the possibility of simply across-the-board reductions," Bascom said.

The City Council formed a three-member committee last Monday night to rank certain policy decisions involved in the implementation of Eugene Decisions.

This committee, composed of Bascom and councilmen Shawn Boles and Randy MacDonald, plans to rank what areas the council needs to focus on to implement the proposed deficit reduction plans.

Bascom said the committee was going to "try to give the council directions on where to go next."

Some of the committee's plans include a review of the 18 city boards and commissions, which Bascom said are very staff-demanding, and to see how the city can reduce the cost of the budget process.
