## Hot-shooting Ducks win second straight

The Oregon men's basketball team went on a 21-5 run midway through the first half and held off a late surge by Athletes in Action to beat the touring group of former college basketball players 100-90 at MacArthur Court on Sunday night.

Sophomore guard Orlando Williams came off the bench to score 18 points for the Ducks, including five during Oregon's first half run. Williams had a total of 12 in the opening half, including two three-pointers.

"I just wanted to contribute," Williams said. "I got lots of help from Andre Collier and Johnny Reece, who got me the ball."

The Ducks started strong, shooting 67 percent from the field in the opening half, including five of 10 shots from three-point range. Oregon led

53-37 at halftime and stretched the lead to 87-63 before AIA made a late charge.

Trailing 98-81 late in the game, guard Rod Foster hit two consecutive three-pointers as AIA scored nine straight points to cut the lead to eight points with less than a minute remaining, but the Ducks held on for the victory.

"It was like two different games tonight," Oregon head coach Jerry Green said. "We really hit a groove for a while, but with about 10 minutes left in the game we reverted back to what I call educational street ball, everyone tried to do things for themselves."

AIA was led by Foster, a former UCLA and Phoenix Suns' guard, who scored 26 points, including five three-pointers. Former Duck Eric Dunn scored 10 points and grabbed seven rebounds for AIA.
