



### Duck defense soaks Beavers Oregon holds Oregon State to 110

yards in blustery 7-0 Civil War victory

CORVALLIS - Oregon won back the state Saturday.


It wasn't pretty at rain-soaked Parker Stadium, but the Ducks managed to demolish the Oregon State option offense and sneak away with a 7-0 victory in the 96th Civil War game.

'I don't care if we would have won by one point," Oregon head coach Rich Brooks said. "In these conditions, believe me, a win's a win. If you can win in these conditions. you're doing something right."

The win gave Oregon a 6-5 record, 4-4 in the Pacific-10 Conference, and kept alive its chances of being invited to the Independence Bowl

With the rain falling at a steady rate throughout the game and winds gusting up to 30 miles an hour, the first half struck up memories of 1983's 0-0 tie at Autzen Stadium.

But the Ducks ended any fears of that when quarterback Danny O'Neil hit tight end Willy Tate on a three-yard touchdown pass with 35 sec-

onds left in the first half for the only score of the game.
