Bands to watch for next term include Jolly Mon, The Strangers, Boogie Patrol Express and Multiple Sarcasm. The Lazy Porch Dogs, the "acoustical alter ego" of Jam Bay may be scheduled and are also possibly going to try an acoustical night with the Sugar Beets and the Mad Farmers.

At the beginning of each term a poster is hung near the EMU food services that gives a schedule of coming events at the beer gardens. The poster describes each of the scheduled bands for the term and dates when they will be playing.
