will carry gear and provide first aid, bicycle repair, snacks and water.

The riders will camp each night in towns along the Oregon Trail, and will be entertained by folk singers and storytellers during the evenings.

"Part of the ride is to educate the riders on the history of the trail and the area," Armstrong said, "and folk singing and storytelling were a part of the pioneers' journey."

Armstrong originally suggested the ride was not for novice bicyclists, because it covers about 50 to 80 miles per day, with one 95-mile day. But he also added, "Riding that far is a mental, as

well as a physical, thing. A novice could do it, if they put their mind to it."

Along the Oregon Trail, many of the townspeople Armstrong approached to ask about camping were skeptical at first.

"Once I mentioned that I wanted to bring 150 bicyclists through their town and camp there, there was a pause," Armstrong said. "Once I explained it, they began to get into it."

Armstrong said at first many town officials were worried the riders might be disruptive, but now "they're looking forward to it. If the town is on the Oregon Trail, that sets them apart."

The towns the riders will stay in will benefit financially from this tour. Armstrong said part of each rider's participation fee will go to the towns in return for

meals and camping.

"Some not-for-profit groups are putting together meals, the dinners and breakfasts," Armstrong said, "and it's

giving the community a chance to make some money. As long as we spread this money back into the community, everyone will be happy."

Besides fostering an awareness of the history of the Oregon Trail, Armstrong said he also hopes to establish an awareness of bicycle travel.

Armstrong said he hopes state governments will begin to plan for bicycle travel when designing and repairing highways.
