help those in need.

Toys for Tots" is a 45-year holiday tradition established to help provide needy families with toys for their children. The Christmas gift program is co-sponsored by the International Association of Firefighters and the United States Marine Corps Reserve.

New, unwrapped toys and cash donations are being collected, between now an Dec. 18 at Eugene and Springfield Fire stations and also at the Marine Corps Reserve Center. The toys are collected and unwrapped so they may be categorized by age and gender for distribution to the needy chil-

"For some kids, the toy we provide is their only toy," said Mike Moskoritz, publicity chairman for Toys for Tots. "We know from the bright smiles on children's faces and from the grateful appreciation from their parents, that the simple fact of a shiny, new toy something that most of us take for granted — can make a tremendous difference in the life of a child."

Last year approximately 5,000 children in the Eugene/Springfield area received toys through the program. Moskovitz said the need this year will probably be even greater.

"Our volunteers work very hard to make Toys for Tots a success, but we could never do it without the support of concerned citizens and businesses," Moskovitz said. "It's a way all of us can give back to the community and to less fortunate children.
