Hoop doubleheader tonight at Mac Court

Diehard Duck fans will get a chance to see both the men's and women's basketball teams tonight as the two compete in back-to-back games at McArthur Court.

The women play in the opening game against Brigham Young at 4:30 p.m., followed by the men's game against Alaska-Fairbanks

Judging from the way the two teams have played so far this season, the women's game could be considered the main attraction

Oregon's women are coming off an impressive showing at

the O'Charley's Classic over the weekend. The Ducks knocked off No. 13 Southwest Missouri State and lost by only four points to the third-ranked host of the tournament, Vanderbilt.

The success Oregon had at the tourney has the team ranked No. 29 in the nation coming into tonight's game.

Head coach Elwin Heiny said his team's play in the tournament gives the team something to build on.

"I was very happy with our play," he said. "We played well and reduced our turnovers in the second game. We showed growth from our exhi-

Wilson will try out for the U.S. team again next summer to play in the Junior World Championships.

The best news for Wilson

over the summer was she was able to play and stay healthy, and she says she expects the same thing to happen this year with the Ducks.

Wilson and Sporcich are the keys to Oregon's offense, but were only able to play in two games together last season because of injuries.

"Last year was unfortunate because it seemed like Debbie and I never had the opportunity to play together," Wilson said. "This year we are out for revenge."

Heiny is looking forward to the prospect of Wilson and Sporcich on court together for an entire season.

'We want to get the ball to Sara and Debbie as much as possible and have them shoot," Heiny said. "They are outstanding players, and we definitely want to incorporate them into the offense."

The Ducks are 1-1 after beating 13th-ranked Southwest Missouri State and barely losing to No. 3 Vanderbilt at the O'Charley's Classic in Nashville last weekend.

Wilson struggled in the first game when she scored five points. In the second game, Wilson had 21 points and nine rebounds, behind only Sporcich who scored 25 points and grabbed 18 re-

Wilson says she expects big things from the team.

"We definitely have high expectations," Wilson said. "We came close to beating the No. 3 team in the country and that gave us confidence. Now we must not let up; we need to improve.'


