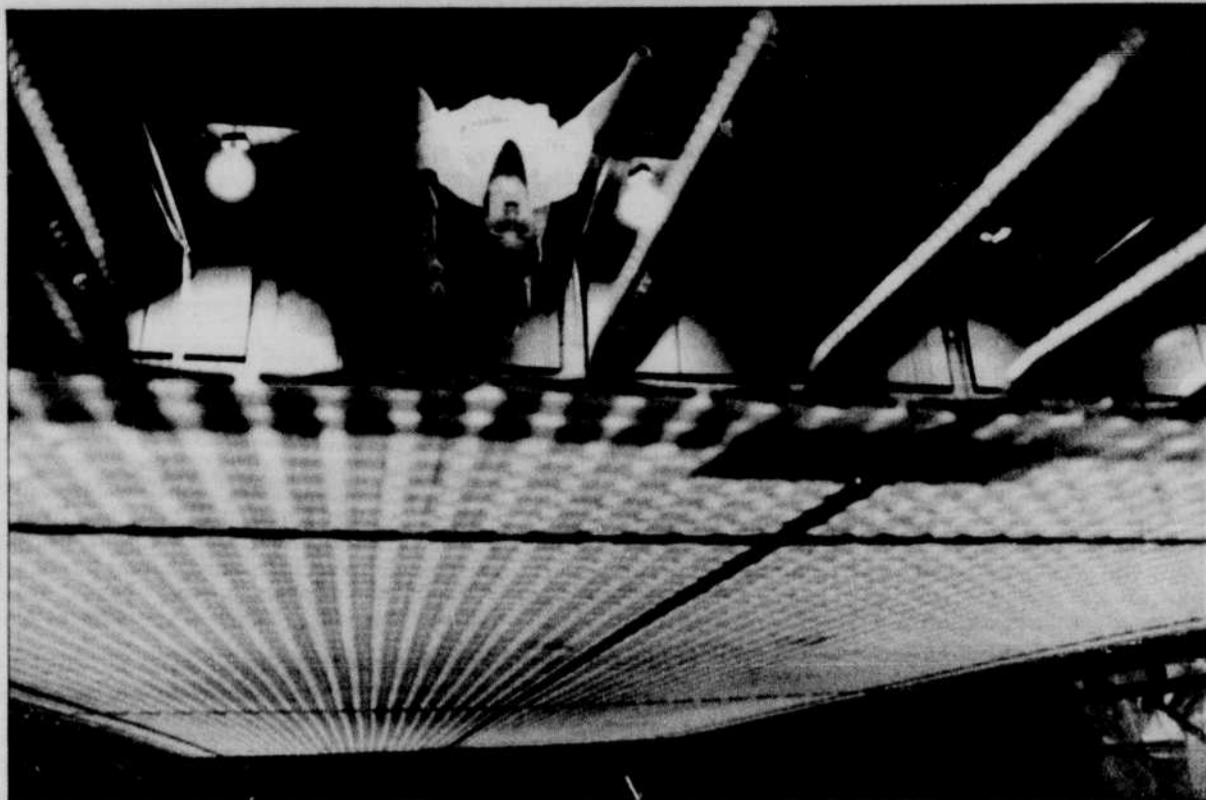

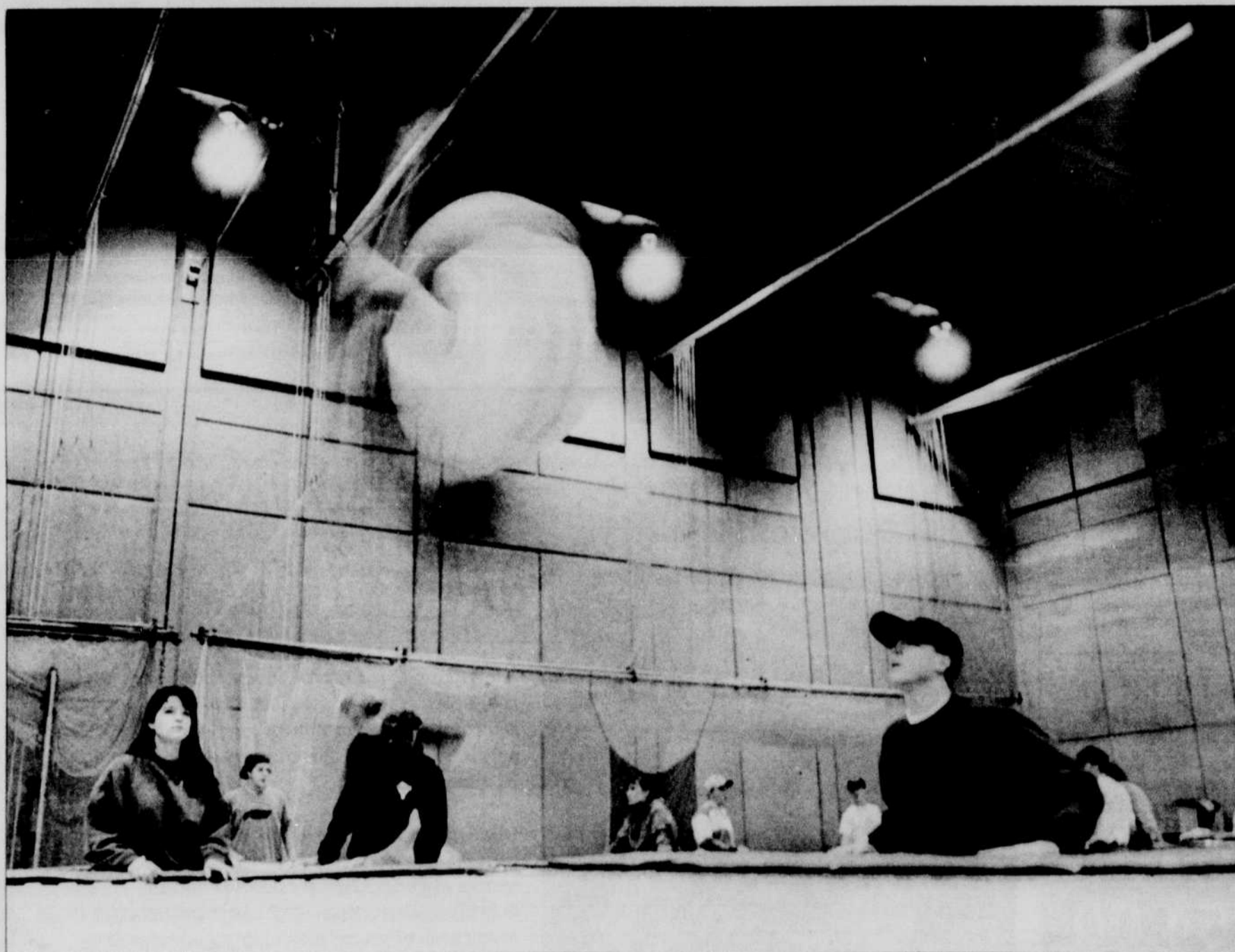

POLICE BEAT

The following incidents were reported to the Office of Public Safety and the Eugene police department from Dec. 1-7.

- A University student attempted suicide on Dec. 2. Police were responding to a report of a prowler on the 2000 block of Madrona Drive when they saw a man on a deck. When the police approached the man he jumped from the deck headfirst into the ground below. Accord-

ing to police reports, the man dropped about 20 feet. The student was taken to the hospital for observation and was treated for a cut on his left hand.

- A 21-year-old man was arrested for unlawful possession of a controlled substance and unlawful delivery of a controlled substance on Dec. 4. According to police reports, a police officer observed the suspect on the 500 block of East

13th Avenue selling drugs. When the officer searched the man he found packets containing psilocybin mushrooms, LSD and tar heroin. The man was also carrying \$477 in cash.

- A University student and his 29-year-old friend reported an assault on Dec. 5. The two men were at Guido's on the 800 block of East 13th Avenue when they were each punched in the face by the same suspect.

One of the victims said the suspect had flipped him off inside the bar and he returned the gesture. When the victims were walking out of the bar the suspect punched them and fled on foot.

- A University student attempted suicide on Dec. 5. The student jumped from the Autzen Footbridge into Willamette River. According to police reports, police had contacted the

student earlier that day after receiving a call from one of the student's professors. The professor told police he thought the student might jump from the footbridge.

Police talked to the student but released him because he did not meet the criteria for a police hold. After the student jumped, he told police he was depressed over some problems at school.
