Sara Wilson began last season hoping to establish herself as one of the best players in the Pacific-10 Conference.

One year, and a foot injury later, Wilson is looking to do the same thing this year.

Wilson, a 6-foot-3 junior, is Oregon's starting center and, along with forward Debbie Sporcich, she is expected to be the focal point of the Ducks' offense. Wilson was in the same situation last year after coming off a freshman season in which she averaged 6.8 points and 4.9 rebounds per game, but a variety of injuries and illnesses allowed her to play in only 15 of Oregon's 28 games.

"It is unbelievable how frustrating last season was," Wilson said. "It was sort of a wasted season because I was never able to reach my potential. against UCLA. Wilson was forced to sit out Oregon's first eight games of the 1991-92 season with mononucleosis and a stress fracture in her right foot. Wilson returned to average 9.1 points and 5.8 rebounds per game before a stress fracture in her left foot ended her season prematurely.

Oregon coach Elwin Heiny calls Wilson one of the hardest


