Packwood plans return to Oregon



PORTLAND (AP) - Sen. Bob Packwood said Wednesday he hopes to return to Oregon on Jan. 26.

The Oregon Republican has not returned to his home

state since allegations surfaced that he made unwanted sexual advances to some female employees and associates.

The allegations are the subject of an investigation by the Senate Ethics Administration.

In an interview with radio station KXL, Packwood said. "I hope to be back two weeks from next Monday.

Packwood said the ethics controversy has not

hampered his ability to function in office.

"It is not a great problem because most of the controversy is handled by lawyers," he said.

Packwood indicated last month he would return to Oregon shortly after he was sworn in Jan. 5 for his sixth term.

But aide Bobbi Munson said the senator decided to remain in Washington until after Bill Clinton is inaugurated on Jan. 20.

"He has to stay here because there is work to do here and that is what the people of Oregon voted him into office to do," Munson said. "He would come under criticism if he was out in Oregon traveling with all these important confirmations going on.
