Last season, Antoine Stoudamire did it all for the Ducks, averaging 20 points a game. Although his average has slipped to 17 this season, Stoudamire has continued to be the leader for Oregon. The big difference has been the contributions he has received from the players around him.


Orlando Williams has, at times, been unconscious from outside. He is averaging 13 points so far this season and is hitting more than 40 percent of his shots from three-point range.

With Green's system of selfsubstitutions, every player has contributed in one way or another. Point guards Andre Collier and Johnnie Reece have shown marked improvement in running the Oregon offense, and forwards Jeff Potter and Aaron Johnson have given the Ducks some strength inside.

Oregon's main problem has been the inability to hold on to big leads. Numerous times this season, the Ducks have built up seemingly insurmountable leads, but have slacked off and allowed opponents back into the games.

"We still haven't learned work commitment in games," Green said. "We have in practice, but we still slack off in games sometimes. I think we've shown that we have the possibility of being a very good team, but saying it and doing it are two very different things."

Oregon faces the Bears and Stanford this weekend and will have its home opener on Jan. 14 against UCLA.
