# Ducks head south for dual meets

The Oregon wrestling team will get a chance to see whether it is a Pacific-10 Conference contender or pretender this weekend as the team travels to California for dual meets with Fresno State, Cal State-Bakersfield, and Cal State-Fullerton.

The Ducks have been inconsistent during the early season. After losing decisively to Oregon State 23-11 in early December, Oregon rebounded to take second place in the Oregon Classic tournament last week, beating solid teams from Boise State and Wyoming in the process.

The match with CSU-Bakersfield promises to be the closest of the weekend. The Roadrunners narrowly edged the Ducks 84.5 to 84 for third place at the Pac-10 tournament last year, and Bakersfield head coach T.J. Kerr anticipates another nail biter this weekend.

"I haven't had the opportunity to see the Oregon wrestlers yet this year, but we've traditionally had close matches with Oregon over the years, and this year should be no different," Kerr said.

Kerr said his team's major problem is inexperience, with only one returnee from last year's squad, 177 pounder Jassen Froehlich. Froehlich placed fourth in the Pac-10 tournament a year ago.

Kerr said that Saturday's dual meet will be a preview of the conference third place battle.

"I don't think that either Oregon or Bakersfield

can beat Oregon State or Arizona State for the title, but both teams will be in the hunt for third at the conference tournament," said Kerr.

Oregon head coach Ron Finley said the most difficult match of the weekend will be the non-conference meet with Fresno State Friday night. The Bulldogs are the defending Western Athletic Conference champions and are ranked 16th in the latest national poll.

"Fresno State has five individuals ranked within the top twelve in the nation," said Finley. "That's the highest number of ranked individuals will see in any one dual meet this year."

The Bulldogs are led by heavyweight Lorenzo Neal, who is ranked third in the nation. Neal doubles as a lineman on the Fresno State football team and figures to be an National Football League draft choice this year.

Oregon has never lost to CSU-Fullerton in five dual meet encounters, but the Titans figure to be a much better team this year than the one that lost to the Ducks 27-15 last year in Eugene. The Titans, 3-1 in non-conference dual meets, are led by two-time NCAA tournament qualifier Laszlo Molnar at 177 pounds.

The top wrestler for the Ducks in the early season has been 190 pound sophomore Jeff McCoy. McCoy is 11-5 and was named the Outstanding Wrestler in the Oregon Classic tournament. McCoy has pinned two of his opponents this year, one being the ninth-ranked wrestler in the country, Les Gutches of Oregon State.
