and the spirit of his ideas by participating in the events that will go from Wednesday to Monday," Warren said.

Other highlights of the celebration include a play titled "Real Women Have Curves" that will be performed at Carson dining hall and a march from the Eugene Public Library to Martin Luther King Jr. Park. The finale of events will be the "The Dream Lives On Jubilee" at the Hult Center for the Performing Arts with Berry as the keynote speaker.

Poetry readings by Hemphill will take place throughout the week. The first reading will be at 7 tonight in the EMU's Gumwood Room. In addition, students and faculty from the University's creative writing program will present their own readings.

Hemphill, an award winning author, poet, editor and cultural activist is a University artist-in-residence. Hemphill's writings come directly from his experiences as a gay black in America. Hemphill is known for his no-nonsense style of poetry, which is sometimes considered very graphic.

Berry, a scholar, author, attorney, historian and modern-day civil-rights activist, was one of the women chosen to be photographed by Brian Lanker, artist of "I Dream a World: Portraits of Black Women Who Changed America."

Berry has been involved in many civil- and human-rights struggles, including the release of African National Congress leader Nelson Mandela from prison.

Berry is one of the founders of the Free South Africa Movement and was jailed many times for her anti-apartheid activities.

Berry's address will be as keynote speaker for "The Dream Lives On Jubilee" at the Hult Center at 7:30 Monday. Berry will discuss the state of present and future civil- and human-rights struggles.

The BSU will be having a vigil and march as part of the celebration festivities.

The vigil will go from Johnson Hall to Gerlinger Lounge and will take place on Friday the 15th to honor the death of King.

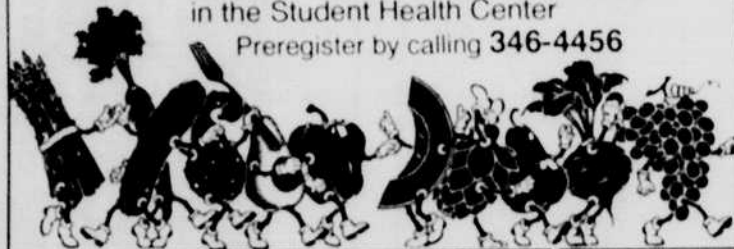
