POLICE BEAT

The following incidents were reported to the Office of Public Safety and the Eugene police department Jan. 4-11.

• A 21-year-old man was cited for possession of less than an ounce of marijuana on the 500 block of East 13th Avenue on Jan. 4. The man was cited after yelling at a police officer who had pulled over a separate subject for a traffic violation. The man yelled at the officer for about three minutes for pulling over the other man for the traffic offense, and then pointed to his bag and said, "Thanks for the recording."

The officer said he had reason to believe the man was recording a person-to-person conversation without telling the other party, which is a crime. The officer searched the man's bag and found a bag of marijuana, a marijuana pipe and cigarette paper with marijuana in it. No recording device was found on the subject.

• A 21-year-old University

student was cited Jan. 6 for failure to appear for a urinating in public charge that he was cited for last fall. Police cited the student when he came into the police station to report his vehicle stolen. Police ran a check on the student and found that he had an outstanding warrant. The vehicle was not stolen but had been borrowed by the student's roommate, according to police reports.

• A 20-year-old man was cited for minor in possession and failure to represent his correct age on Jan. 6. Police saw the man come out of Guido's bar on the 800 block of East 13th Avenue and throw a cup of liquor into the street. Officers approached the man and asked for his identification.

The man produced a driver's license that said he was 20 years old. The officer then asked for the ID that the man used to get into the bar. The officer said he witnessed the man

pass what looked like an ID to friend. Police then arrested the suspect. According to police reports, the man started to cry on the way to the station and said, "You can't arrest me. White people don't go to jail."

• A University student was arrested and cited with disorderly conduct for his role in a snowball fight on Jan. 8. The student was observed by the arresting officer at the 1500 block of Alder Street. According to police reports, the suspect was standing in the street when he threw an ice-ball at the driver's window of a police car. The officer in the car arrested the man when he recognized him at a later snow-throwing incident.

• The House of Records, 258 E. 13th Ave., reported a theft that took place sometime between Dec. 23-28. The suspect apparently reached behind the counter and took 50 Faith No More concert tickets numbered

651-700. Police warn people not to buy tickets for Sunday's concert from people on the streets. People who show up at the concert with stolen tickets will not get in, police said. If people have bought tickets with a number between 651 and 700 police ask you to call the campus police office at 346-2905.

• OPS has received numerous complaints about bicycles parked against street meters, particularly on the 1300 and 1400 blocks of Kincaid Street. OPS said the bikes are falling over on the sidewalk and creating a hazard for pedestrians. Bikes must be parked in designated spaces, and those parked in or near public thoroughfares and in places where they might endanger persons will be cited and may be impounded. OPS suggests people park their bikes on the west side of Kincaid adjacent to the large PLC parking lot, or at the bike racks on East 13th Avenue.
